OCSA COACHES PROPOSE CHANGES FOR 1963 SEASON

Besides arranging the scheduling for the 1963 season, the OCSA coaches made several recommendations for the upcoming year. In the meeting held at Ohio Wesleyan on November 17, the coaches decided that all OCSA teams would use a game ball which had the following specifications:

1. All leather
2. 16 to 18 panels
3. Bladder inclosed
4. A solid color

Most of the coaches felt that the plastic coated collegiate ball seemed to be the most satisfactory. It was also established that the OCSA would approach the National Soccer Coaches Rules Committee for a proposed change in timekeeping. It will be recommended to stop the clock after each goal and also to increase the time between quarters from one minute to three minutes.

AKRON DOMINATES ALL-OHIO SOCCER TEAM

Akron, winner of the OCSA title, placed five men on the All-Ohio Soccer first team, while seven other schools each had one representative. Akron's Pete Milich and Rich Crites were the only repeaters with Milich being named for the third straight year. Second place Ohio Wesleyan dominated second team selections with four while Oberlin and Akron gained two spots each.

Akron, the 1964 Collegiate Soccer Association Champion, led the Association in placing six players on the All-Midwest soccer squad. Of the All-Midwest teams involved only Michigan State, with seven, placed more.

Other Association teams who placed men on the squad were Ohio Wesleyan (4), Ohio University (3), Oberlin and Denison (2), and Dayton placed 1.

Only Oberlin's outstanding goalie, John Pritchard, cracked the first team dominated by St. Louis and Michigan State. Neil Kochosky, Dave Williams and George Otieno of the Akron Zips did manage second team picks as did John Eastman of Ohio University.

For the first time in many a year the Association failed to place at least one player on the All-American team.
