

You might regard Bob Harrison as a busy man in his field. At Kenyon College, Bob Harrison is head coach in three sports--basketball, tennis and soccer. He has handled all three for the last 10 years.

This last year Harrison's cagers compiled an 18-6 mark (breaking 18 records en route) and his tennis team finished 7-3, good enough for second place in the Ohio Conference. However, Harrison's big thrill for the year was the performance of his soccer team which he led to the runnerup spot in the NCAA College Division Mideast Regional.

Harrison took essentially the same team that in 1966 had won only four of 10 games and molded them into a winning unit. While compiling a 7-4-1 record the Lord booters established nine new Kenyon standards. For his outstanding coaching effort Harrison has been rewarded by being voted the 1967 Ohio Collegiate Soccer Coach of the Year.

QUEIROGA AND ALTERI SHARE SPOTLIGHT ON ALL-OHIO TEAM

BOB HARRISON VOTED OHIO SOCCER COACH OF THE YEAR

Sharing the spotlight on the 1967 All-Ohio soccer team are Joe Queiroga of Akron and Oberlin's Jeff Alteri. A second team All-American center halfback last season, Queiroga helped the Zip booters win their eighth Ohio Collegiate Soccer Association title in 10 years. Center forward Alteri kicked 15 goals in guiding Oberlin to an 8-1 record and a runnerup spot to Akron. Both Queiroga and Alteri were voted the Carl Dale Memorial Trophy emblematic of the Ohio Defensive and Offensive Player of the Year, respectively.


Akron placed six players on the team--three on first and three on the second. Wooster matched the Zips with three first team berths, while Oberlin and Ohio State had two spots each.

Besides Queiroga, Andy Vadnay (Akron) and Mo Rajabi (Wooster) were first team repeaters. Vadnay finished out his college career by being voted on the mythical team for the fourth consecutive year. As a freshman the AU left wing was on the second team, received an honorable mention in 1965 and earned first team spots the last two years.

KENYON'S NED SMYTHE WINS OCSA SCORING TITLE

Ned Smythe, who led Kenyon to its best record since 1955 and the the runnerup spot in the NCAA Mideast Regional, captured the OCSA's individual scoring title with 22 points. Going into the regional battle, Smythe trailed Oberlin's Jeff Alteri by one point. However, in the 4-3 win over Lake Forest, Smythe overtook the Yeoman by talleying two goals. Only a sophomore, Smythe broke every Kenyon individual scoring record en route to the OCSA title.

ALL-MIDWEST SOCCER TEAM ANNOUNCED

East Lansing, Mich. -- NCAA co-champion Michigan State paced the All-Midwest soccer team selections by placing three players on the first unit announced today by the National Soccer Coaches Association through MSU Coach Gene Kenney, selection chairman for the region.

Once-beaten Akron placed two players on the first team, and Denison, Indiana, Ohio, Southern Illinois-Edwardsville, St. Louis and Wheaton each had one representative.

Michigan Staters honored were inside right Tony Keyes, center forward Trevor Harris and inside left Alex Skotarek.

Akron goalie Steen Christianson and center halfback Fritz Schier were picked.

Rounding out the first eleven were right fullback Bob Burnham, Denison; outside left Reval Freeman, Indiana; left fullback Ihor Miskewycz, Ohio; outside right Jack Blake, Southern Illinois-Edwardsville; left halfback Steve Frank, St. Louis, and right halfback Paul Sherman, Wheaton.

Harris was the only repeater from 1967. Keyes was a first-team choice in 1966.

Cleveland State had three players picked for the second team, while Illinois had two and Akron, Indiana, Lake Forest, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster one each.

The coaches association also listed 33 players for honorable mention. St. Louis led this category with five, and Bowling Green had four.

In total representation on the first and second teams and honorable mention, Michigan State and St. Louis each had six, followed by Akron with five and Wooster and Bowling Green with four each.

MICKEY COCHRANE NAMED OHIO COACH OF THE YEAR

Mickey Cochrane, Bowling Green's first full-time coach, made his fifth year at the helm a memorable one. By guiding his Falcons to a 7-3 record and second straight winning season, Cochrane was voted by his fellow Ohio coaches as Ohio Soccer Coach of The Year. It was a fitting tribute to Cochrane, a gentleman both on and off the field and a recognized national leader in soccer. He is currently serving as president of the National Soccer Coaches Association.

ALL-OHIO SOCCER TEAM NAMED

Wooster's Pierre Radja and Cleveland State's Jim McMillan were presented with the most coveted awards in the annual OCSA All-Ohio Team voting. For the second straight year Radja was declared the OCSA's Most Outstanding Defensive Player while McMillan received the offensive counterpart of the Carl Dale Memorial Trophy.

Cleveland State and Kenyon dominated first team All-Ohio selections with three each. Akron and Wooster placed two each and Miami and Ohio U one. The only other first team repeater besides Radja, who also made the team in 1967, was CSU's Vito Colonna.

MR. SOCCER RETIRES

Those among us who have learned to appreciate top-notch collegiate soccer, and have thrilled to the year-after-year successes of his teams, are truly sorry to see Akron University Soccer Coach William "Stu" Parry retiring. He leaves a tremendous gap to fill.

After pioneering the sport at the Hilltop in 1954, Parry went on to compile a coaching record of 118 victories and only 43 losses and four ties over 15 seasons. His teams have defeated some of the best in the country, won nine Ohio Collegiate Soccer Association titles, and four times entered National Collegiate Athletic Association playoffs.

In 1968 the Zip booters -- one of Parry's best teams -- ran up II straight victories before falling to Michigan State, 1-0, in NCAA tournament play. Perhaps as impressive as the score was the turnout of 2,300 at Akron U's Lee Jackson Field that day.

When Parry came to Akron U from Oberlin, there were only six recognized college teams playing soccer in Ohio. Today there are 40, and Stu has had as much, or more, to do with building interest as anybody.
